

CREST SPECIALITY RESINS PRIVATE LIMITED RISK MANAGEMENT POLICY Amendment Approved by Board on 14th April, 2025





1. SCOPE:

Pursuant to Section 134(3) of the Companies Act, 2013, this Risk Management Policy ("Policy") establishes the ideology of Crest Speciality Resins Private Limited ("Company"), towards risk identification, analysis, and prioritization of risks. For mitigation and managing the risk at "Crest Speciality Resins Private Limited" (hereinafter referred to as the "Company"), the Company has formed the policy (the "Risk Management Policy") for the same.

2. OBJECTIVE:

The objective of this Policy is to manage the risks involved in all activities of the Company, to ensure sustainable business growth and to create and protect shareholders' value by minimizing threats or losses and maximizing opportunities.

The objectives of the Policy can be summarized as follows -

- To protect and enhance the corporate governance.
- To implement a process to identify potential / emerging risks;
- To manage risks with an institutionalized framework and consistently achieving desired outcomes;
- To implement special tools for risk management;
- To align and integrate views of risk across the Company.
- To develop and support people and the knowledge base of the organization

3. APPLICABILITY:

This Policy applies to all areas of the Company's operations.

4. **DEFINITION**:

"Company" means "Crest Speciality Resins Private Limited", a Company constituted under the provisions of Companies Act, 1956.

"Board", means the Board of Directors of the Company.

"Audit Committee or Committee" means Committee of the Board of Directors of the Company in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

"Policy" means Risk Management Policy.

"Risk" A risk is an event which can prevent, hinder, or fail to further or otherwise obstruct the company in achieving its objectives.

"Risk Management" is the systematic process of protecting business resources and income against losses so that the objectives of the Company can be achieved without unnecessary interruption.

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5. CONSTITUENTS OF A SOUND RISK MANAGEMENT SYSTEM:

The risk management system in the Company should have the following key features:

- Active board of directors, committee and senior management oversight;
- Appropriate policies, procedures and limits;
- Comprehensive and timely identification, measurement, mitigation, controlling, monitoring and reporting of risks;
- · Appropriate management information systems at the business level;
- Comprehensive internal controls in accordance with current regulations; and
- A risk culture and communication framework

6. RISK GOVERNANCE:

Effective risk management is dependent upon having an appropriate risk governance structure and well-defined roles and responsibilities. Risk governance signifies the way the business and affairs of the Company are directed and managed by its board of directors and executive management.

7. RISK FACTORS:

The objectives of the Company are subject to both internal and external risks that are associated with the business of the Company are listed below:-

Internal Risk Factors

- Compliance Risk;
- Human Resource Risk;
- Operational Risk;
- Hurdles in optimum use of resources;
- Environmental Management
- Project Execution;
- Quality Assurance;

External Risk Factors

- Technological Risk:
- Political Environment;
- Economic Environment and Market conditions;
- Foreign Exchange Risk;
- Inflation and Cost Structure;
- Competition Risk;
- Legal risk;

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8. RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESS:

The risk management process contains the following key elements:

I. Identification of risks: Risk identification implies finding, recognizing and describing exposure to uncertainty in the market in which it operates, the legal, social, political and cultural environment in which it exists and the alignment with its strategic and operational objectives along with identification of its root cause.

On a bi-annual basis: Functional Heads shall identify, assess and monitor the risks pertaining to it in the following broad categories:

- Industry Risks
- Operational Risks
- Macroeconomic Risks affecting the Company.
- **II. Risk Assessment:** Risk Assessment for the purpose of this Policy means the quantification of the impact of risks to determine their potential severity and the likelihood of occurrence of the risk to determine frequency. Based on this, risks shall be categorized into Low, Medium & High Risks.

For the risks identified, Functional Heads shall carry out the following Risk Assessment exercise on a bi-annual basis:

- a. Risks shall be assessed for
 - i) the Impact to ascertain potential severity and
 - ii) Likelihood of Occurrence and categorization into Low, Medium and High based on risk appetite.
- **b.** Mitigation Plan with timelines shall be prepared / updated for all risks. Mitigation plan may include any one of the following:
 - Accept Risk
 - Reduce Risk
 - Share/Transfer Risk
 - Avoid / Eliminate Risk
- **III. Risk Monitoring:** Functional Heads shall be responsible for monitoring the mitigation plans as approved and submit the status of the mitigation plan on a half-yearly basis.
- IV. Creation / Updation of the Risk Register: Risk Register shall be the key document used to communicate the current status of all known risks.
- V. Review and Reporting:
 - A. Identified Risks:





- Functional Heads while reviewing the updated Risk Register shall identify the Key Risks (along with the mitigation plan) for the purpose of reporting on a half-yearly basis.
- Board shall review the Report.

B. Status of Implementation of Mitigation Plans:

- The status of implementation of the approved Mitigation plans shall be reviewed by the Functional Heads and reported to committee on a half-yearly basis.
- VI. Re-visit Risk Categorization: Functional Heads shall re-visit the categorization of risks into Low, Medium and High risk annually or earlier if the need arises.

9. RISK MANAGEMENT ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The risk management roles and responsibilities will be as follows:

Board	Approve and review the risk policy.

10. REVIEW OF THE POLICY:

This Policy shall be reviewed by the Board to ensure it meets the requirements of legislation and the needs of the organization and the Policy shall be posted on the website of the Company.

11. AMENDMENT:

Any change in the Policy shall be approved by the Board of Directors of the Company. The Board of Directors shall have the right to withdraw and/or amend any part of this Policy or the entire Policy, the decision of the Board in this respect shall be final and binding, and any subsequent amendment/modification in the Act or any other laws/regulations in this regard shall automatically apply to this Policy.
